What not to read when:

Airport, by Arthur Hailey: During a snow storm. If you remember the book, or movie, it takes place during a gigantic snow storm. I read the book in 1970, I think, during Christmas break. After shoveling walks, the snow was as high as my shoulder. I'd never seen that much snow. It shut down the city for $2\frac{1}{2}$ days.

No Highway, by Nevil Shute: When flying on an airplane. The story involves a mousy kind of man who studies and tests metal fatigue on airplanes. He's convinced that the tails of a certain aircraft are about to fall off all the planes flown by the company he works for. And the story goes from there. I read the book while I was in England, and then, before flying home, planes were grounded because the tails were falling off the Boeing 747s and all planes had to be checked.

The Black Tower, by P.D. James: On a windy night. One of the creepiest passages I have every read lasted no more than about 2 pages. It involved wind, a black night and things that creak in the wind.

Anything from Janet Daily: When sitting at a craft show. Now, I don't remember if it was a Janet Daily book, but I do know it was one of those romantic fiction books, sometimes known as beach reads. I'm just saying, there are things you probably shouldn't read while in public.

Okay, those reads all happened by accident. I just happened to be reading them when other events intruded. But it's easy to come up with other books not to read when...

Jaws, by Peter Benchley: While on vacation on a beach. Or in Louisiana, where there's recently been a swarm of sharks about 30 miles off the coast. But they seem to be more interested in oil rigs, so unless you're into visiting oil rigs, you're probably safe.

Isaac's Storm, by Erik Larsen: While visiting a coastal city (like Galveston) during hurricane season. It's a brilliant account of the tragic story of hurricane that hit Galveston in 1900. The story is told from the perspective of Isaac Cline, one of America's first meteorologists. The Galveston hurricane was the deadliest hurricane in US history, and the second costliest hurricane in U.S. history--comparing relative dollar costs, even with Katrina.

Poseidon Adventure, by Paul Gallico: While on a cruise, of course. Paul Gallico, if you have never read anything by him, is a great story teller (as is Shute, one of the best). Gallico wrote (The Three Lives of) Thomasina, The Magic Man; Love, Let Me Not Hunger

(about a circus); The Abandoned (another cat story) and many others.

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
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Bucking Horse and Rider fans!

This fabric will be available end of May 2015.






I now have the forms for the contest.

Machine Servicing Mon Mar 30, 10-6

Beginning Machine Applique

Wed. April 1, 1:00-4 or 6-9 \$25 Barb Boyer

So many quilts use applique these days. Learn the ins and outs of machine applique, from points to curves. We will practice the button hole/blanket stitch, satin stitch, and you can also play around with your decorative stitches. Threads, fusibles and stabilizers will be discussed.

Back Basting Applique Thur. April 2, 1-3 Sandra Freeburg \$25 Back basting is a template free method of needle turn applique. No slippery freezer paper or chalked lines on top that never seem to get turned under quite right. This method is especially great for traveling, because your pieces will be basted onto your background -- no need for pins to get in the way. This class is great for beginners and all levels of appliquers. Don't let hand applique frustrate you. It's really easy and relaxing!

Block of the Month Sat. April 4, 10:30-11:15 FREE Join at any time. You get a free fat quarter if you come to class with the previous month's completed block. This year we're making a neutrally colored quilt (tans, taupes, greys, etc.)-come to class in January to see an example.

ABCs of Binding Sat. April 4, noon-1 \$20 Jo Sunderman Learn the ins and outs of selecting binding, cutting binding and applying binding. It's easier than you think. If you have a project you are working on, be sure to bring it to class for some hands on advice.

We will be making different table runners each month. This table runner uses the 12" 60 degree triangle and a large (10"-11") border stripe. Kit will include fabric and the ruler (if you already have a ruler, ruler price will be deducted from kit price).

Knitting: Back to Basics. Mon. April 13 6-8:30 \$20 Carol Moler Each month we will offer a selection of projects for the beginner and more advanced knitter. In April we learn how to join in the round. Beginning project will either be a hat or a cowl. For more experienced knitters, the project will be a longer twisted cowl or a bag suitable for felting at a later date.

Mastering Curves & Free Motion Quilting

Thursday April 30 1:00-4 OR 6-9 \$50 Barb Boyer & Sue Frerich This is a 4 part class, offered on consecutive Thursdays through May 21. We will work on a whole cloth project, each week adding new designs. Class #1: straight lines (with darning/hopping foot), grasses, zig zags, trees. Class #2: flowers & leaves. Class #3: stippling & fill stitches. Class #4: free hand shapes, from clouds to birds, to animals. In class students will practice the designs and then start adding the designs on the whole cloth quilt.

Hand Applique Club Thursday April 30 1:30-4 free The last Thursday of each month, we're getting together to practice our hand applique skills. The Club is open to all skill levels. We want to share what we've learned, find new patterns, and simply just sit and sew. More and more patterns are showing applique work, and while sometimes you can just fuse it down, learning how to hand applique is a wonderful skill that can be carried anywhere you go.

This is another get-together class to sit & knit, work on our projects, share information and get some help. We will share techniques, suggest patterns, but mainly we'll sit & knit (or pick).
