The corners of the log cabin blocks (the ones on each end) have a 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" square of a quilt block in the attic window corner (the small block square). This Row goes with last year's row. Just think, in another couple of year's, we'll have a whole quilt! Keep collecting!



May 20, 2016

We're here at Spring Market! And we don't have hot water in our room.

Let me back up & explain.

We left Cheyenne Wednesday morning & drove to Salt Lake City. We stopped at 4 Wyoming quilt shops & had a great time. Wednesday night we attended an event -- one with lots of great giveaways (i.e. bolts of fabric), but we didn't win. Sigh.

Thursday started at 8:30 with 16 different classes (Schoolhouse Sessions) that ran until 6 p.m. and if I had my Fitbit on, I know I probably clocked 3-4 miles of walking back & forth from class to class. Well, maybe not 4 miles. Maybe 3? Just kidding. More like 2 miles, because, of course, I wanted to attend the classes that were held in rooms 502 (on the right end of the Salt Palace--think opposing team's goal line) and then 550 at the other end of the Salt Palace (think our team's goal line).

These sessions introduced us to new things from fabric companies, pattern designers, and notions & tools designers. We picked up all sorts of great giveaways -- we've got a swag bag going that has patterns, fabric, and notions stuffed inside. You need to know that because we will have an After Market Party when we get home where we will give away what we've been collecting.

After my last session, that ended at 6, I walked across the "bridge" and heard lots of chatter from the floor below -- ladies had already lined up for the "Sample Spree" that wouldn't start until 7. So of course, we got in line and waited until the doors opened and everyone rushed in to buy buy buy. Sample spree is like our Springtime in the Rockies Shop Hop on steroids. Actually, it's a little more like Quilt-A-Fair on steroids. 45 minutes later we were shopped out.

Have you noticed I haven't said much about lunch, dinner, breakfast? We were smart enough to get a good breakfast, because during the Schoolhouse Sessions, we did have box lunches, but I didn't want to miss a session just to eat, so I had about 10 minutes of free time, bolted part of a sandwich, and went back to class. And of course, we didn't eat while standing in line for Sample Spree.

So at 8, we finally had dinner. Then it was back to the hotel to sort through what we had collected so far and to prepare for today (meaning, where to we go for our 8 a.m. classes and what booths are we going to when Market opens at 9:30 -- I have fabric appointments and Sue & Jean have book appointments, freebies to hunt down and Rows 200-2800 to check out, or maybe 500 vendors).

Then at 10:30 the lights went out. Storms hit Salt Lake and lots of the downtown area went dark. It had been raining since about 8, but now it was pouring and power got knocked out. Fortunately, about 45 minutes later we had power. That meant all of our powered devices, with things like alarm clocks, got charged.

Which meant we would wake up by 6 to shower & prepare for Day 2. Meaning, taking hot showers. Nope. By the time the hot water comes on, we'll be in class.

Fortunately, tonight's event is a Moda dinner and the theme is Camping. So, just like the Boy Scouts, we're prepared!


Anyway, that's the up date. It's time to splash water on my face, fluff my hair and find breakfast. Good morning to everyone!





May Classes & Special Events

Changed to Sat. June 18 Christmas Row Quilt 3rd Sat of the month,

Sat. June 18, 1-4 \$20 Barb Boyer

Each row uses a different pieced block. There are log cabins, stockings, wreaths, ornaments, snowmen, trees, houses, bells, and stars. Each month we will piece a different row. There are 7 rows (2 rows use multiple blocks), plus a pieced border. You should be able to have the quilt done by Christmas!

Postponed to May 29: Pillow Case Party Sun. FREE 1-4

If you've never made a pillow case, or just want some time to sew a pillow case, this class is for you. This is a great mother/daughter styled class and pillow cases make great presents!

Bertie's Year & Companions last Friday of the month, 1-4 \$20, free if you buy the kit

Bertie's Year & Perfectly Pieced are small wall hangings, (or you can make each block into a mini quilt for display each month). Bertie is done in flannels and wool (kit only includes flannel). Bertie (the bird) and friends (squirrel, pumpkins) are appliqued with crazy quilt embroidery embellishments. The patterns are by Bonnie Sullivan, and you can do any of the series-she has a spring, summer, fall & winter Bertie's, plus the original, and plus the cats. You choose. Class is ongoing-because we need the time to get the embellishing done!

Friday Nighters Fri. May 27 5:30-? \$10 Barb Boyer

This class will help you get organized for Christmas 2015 -- or just help you get things done. You give me a list of your "to dos" or unfinished projects you want to finish and then each month I check off what you've completed. Trust me. If you need incentive to stay on track, this is it. You can bring your sewing machine or do hand work.

Postponed to May 28: LOTP: Churn Dash Sat. May 28, 10:30-5 \$20 Barb Boyer

We are highlighting Little House of the Prairie fabrics this Spring, and this is our 4th quilt. This is a perfect quilt for scraps. This quilt uses the Churn Dash block and a modified Hold in the Barn Door block for the center of the quilt-which is on point. The Flowers collection from Little House makes this a perfect old fashioned looking quilt-and Mary was tall enough to actually use the churn, so she was able to help her mother churn the butter.

June Classes & Special Events

Block of the Month Sat. June 4 10:30-11:15 FREE Barb Boyer

Join at any time. You get a free fat quarter if you come to class with the previous month's completed block. This year we're making a red, white & blue quilt-patriotic theme, if you like.

Ornament Club 1st Sat of the month, 1:30-3:30 Free, if you buy that month's kit

Each month we will feature a different pieced ornament. Some of the ornaments can be used as gift tags & gift card holders. You can pick & choose which ornaments you want to make-each ornament will be displayed prior to class. You can make the March ornament & skip the April ornament, for example. Kits are limited, though, so if you are interested in a particular kit, be sure to sign up for that month & let me know.

Monthly Minis First Saturday of the Month, Jan-Dec. 4-6 \$10 for the year (plus patterns or kits)

This year we are doing various table runners/ door banners/small wall hanging celebrating each month. Some of the quilts are long & skinny, some square, some round. Most of the quilts will be kitted.

English Paper Piecing 1st & 3rd Mondays ongoing

Knit Pickers' Club Thur. June 9, 6-8:30

Every second Thursday, we're getting together to practice our knitting. The Club is open to all skill levels. We want to share what we've learned, find new patterns, and simply just sit and knit. If you are in the Monday knitting classes, you can work on your project and get help, if you need it.

Mastering Curves & Free Motion Quilting Barb Boyer \$50

Starting June 9 1-4

This is a 4 part class, offered on consecutive Thursdays through June 30. We will work on a whole cloth project, each week adding new designs. Class #1: straight lines (with darning/hopping foot), grasses, zig zags, trees. Class #2: flowers & leaves. Class #3: stippling & fill stitches. Class #4: free hand shapes, from clouds to birds, to animals. In class students will practice the designs and then start adding the designs on the whole cloth quilt.

Hand Embroidery Club Sat. June 11, 10-noon FREE Kathy Sconce

(Club normally meets the 2nd Sat. of each month from 10-noon)

This year we're still doing birds-state birds. We will have between 40-50 birds (some states use the same bird) for you to stitch. Various setting for turning the birds into a quilt will be provided. Color suggestions for the birds will also be offered. As a bonus, you will get the state outlines, state flowers, and other patterns to compliment the birds. You can join anytime.

Beginning Quilting

Sun. starting June 12, 6-9 OR Wed. June 15, 1-4 8 weeks \$65 Barb Boyer

This comprehensive 8-week course will introduce to you almost everything you need to know about piecing a quilt top. Along the way you will learn about color, batting, thread, machines and various techniques to give you the skills to make almost any quilt.

Lace Houses, block of the month Sat. June 11 1-3 Kathy Sconce ongoing.

Machine Applied Binding June 18 10-noon \$20 Barb Boyer

This style of binding uses cording to help keep the binding straight & true. Bring a small quilt, your binding and your sewing machine-check the supply list to make sure you have the right tools (cording, the correct foot, binding cut at the correct width). Putting binding on by machine cuts your time more than in half-and by using cording, you can have a perfectly applied binding with no messy "oops" where your stitching just didn't quite catch the binding on the back side.

Christmas Row Quilt 3rd Sat of the month, starting June 18, 1-4 \$20 Barb Boyer

Each row uses a different pieced block. There are log cabins, stockings, wreaths, ornaments, snowmen, trees, houses, bells, and stars. Each month we will piece a different row. There are 7 rows (2 rows use multiple blocks), plus a pieced border. You should be able to have the quilt done by Christmas!

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BQ: Using a Panel Quilt to Make BQ Quilt, June 25 10:30-5 \$20 Barb Boyer

Save Our Scraps! Quilts! On the 5th Saturday of the month (when it occurs-the next one is in April) we will make a scrappy quilt. This quilt is called Cascading Strips and it works with 2 1/2" precuts plus a background. The pattern is free and instructions for the extra border will be given in class.
