I will announce when sign up for class will begin--and what the ruler is and probably what the project will be and what the time & date for the class. (It won't be until at least November, so if you haven't made the row, you have time.)

This is to thank all of you who supported my row. Now, I know that not everyone was able to vote, so I'm not going to restrict the class to just those who voted (plus, I don't know). But to participate in the class, you have to make my row.



September 16, 2016

The military have a term they use when things don't go quite right. It's called a cluster... Well, you get my drift. And yesterday was that kind of a day around here.

A little background is needed: We are getting new lines painted for parking spots in our lot. And they are going to make the slots a little wider, which is nice. So the painters picked yesterday to paint. Do you remember yesterday? It really rained. But that wasn't what caused the cluster.

No, the painters decided to rope off the entire middle of the parking lot with cones a yellow tape, starting about 7:30-8. You've been to this parking lot. Remember how difficult it is to find parking spaces? Now imagine what it was like at 10, when I got here. But, I told myself, it shouldn't take long to paint new lines. Right.

Three hours later, the guy (I think there was only 1) had left. So in the neighborhood of six hours or so, we got no paint, but had lots of cones blown over. Yes, he left and didn't take his cones with him. And because we are either sheep or law abiding people, we continued to obey the cones & tape and didn't park in the middle of the lot. We kept hunting for spaces around and around and around the perimeter of the lot.

And then it rained. By this time, I'd had it. So I reparked to the middle of the parking lot-I was in a rebellious mood and didn't want to be a sheep. I mean, really, who hasn't blown a red light at 2:30 in the morning when you've been sitting there for 2 minutes with no traffic in sight. Granted, the minute you do that, a cop shows up. But painters aren't cops and I figured I'd just move if any real painting activity looked likely to start. And I figured I might start a trend of ignoring pointless cones. And I was right. The lot happily filled back up. Later the painters came to collect their now useless cones and everything was back to normal.

Needless to say, we don't have new lines. But take heart, this is all supposed to happen again tomorrow. But....

This is my plan. The painters aren't supposed to block off the entire lot. They are supposed to do it in stages. Tomorrow, if the lot is all roped off AND if there is no painting going on, I plan to ignore the cones and park wherever I want. Make them come tell me to move. Let them try.

Because I want to send a message to line painters around the world: 1) Be sensible. If it's so windy that the cones blow over, hire someone whose job it is to pick up blown over cones. One person can't paint and pick up cones, because all he'll be doing is picking up cones. 2) Be kind: Only rope off half the lot that you can do in an hour or so. I understand that means you may have to come back the next day to finish the job-it's hard to rope off a lot that is already filled with cars. But that's the job. 3) Be smart: Watch the weather channel the night before. If it's going to rain all afternoon, rethink your painting plan. 4) Be wise: Follow the property manager's direction to paint the lot in sections. Because if you don't, you may

never be hired again.

This whole incident made me feel a little like Evelyn in Fried Green Tomatoes, who gets cut out of a parking slot by a couple of young things:

Evelyn Couch: Hey! I was waiting for that spot!

Girl #1: Face it, lady, we're younger and faster!

[Evelyn rear-ends the other car six times]

Girl #2: Are you *crazy*?

Evelyn Couch: Face it, girls, I'm older and I have more insurance.

The older I get the more intolerant I become. So line painters, don't mess with me. I may just drive over your wet lines. So there.

And next week maybe I'll tell you how I couldn't figure out how to tuck my sheets under my new Sleep Number mattress and how I had to call the store with a dumb question.....


